Barbara Breuer

Barbara was born in Staten Island, New York, where she lived for most of her life until moving to Florida in January 2011. She received her BBA in advertising from Baruch College/CUNY in 1987 and her MBA in marketing in 2009.

She has been married to her husband, Charlie, for 28 years, and they have one cat and 11 rats.

She has been a Kiwanian for just over 17 years. She joined the Kiwanis Club of Livingston, New Jersey, in 2005 and served in various positions on its board, including president – although she could not complete that term.

After moving to Florida, she joined the Kiwanis of Mount Dora, where she is a past president and currently serves as a Kiwanis Key Club advisor. She is a past lieutenant governor for Florida's division 9 (the Fine 9) and currently serves as K-Kids Administrator for the Florida district.

She began her professional career buying time for commercials to air on television. Then, she worked for the next 16 years at a major daily newspaper (The Staten Island Advance), selling display advertising space. She left the newspaper business to own and operate a custom picture framing retail store for six years in Livingston, New Jersey.

After moving to Florida, she became a REALTOR® and a freelance writer. Barbara's writing spans many topics, including

real estate, legal, health, and beauty, as well as ghostwriting and proofreading. She is in the process of writing her memoirs and editing her husband's book. She joined the Eye of the Tiger while on the Kiwanis cruise in January 2020, where she now serves as co-editor of the EOT newsletter and as marketing and PR co-chair. She also helps by taking minutes at the board meetings and certain committee meetings.



Jeanette Igoe

Jeanette was born and raised in Bismarck, ND, the fourth of nine children.

She aspired to become an artist, and after graduating high school at 17, she studied liberal arts for a year. After finishing her course of study, she joined the Women's Army Corps at 18 and worked in Washington, DC, at the Pentagon for the War Department. During her time in the service she transferred to Frankfurt, Germany where she was injured and after a failed knee surgery, Jeanette took leave with disability and settled in Miami Florida.

She used her GI bill to further her education and attended Miami Dade Junior College for fashion design and merchandising. She later attended LaSalle Correspondence College, where she earned her associate degree in business.

She married in 1971 and moved to Naples, where she opened the first woman-owned computer business, Data Bank Computer Sales and Service. This is where she met Buck Snare, who invited her to a Kiwanis Club meeting with the Kiwanis Club of Northside Naples where she was a member for 34 years.

In 1996, she became a REALTOR® and is still active in the business.

When Dr. Will Blechman introduced the Iodine Deficiency Program (IDD), she was at a convention in Florida, and he asked her to take photos for him. He became her hero and mentor, and she followed him through his Kiwanis career.

He encouraged her to hold office, and so she did. She became president of her home club in 2017-2018, 2019-2020 Communication Chair for Governor Steve LeBlanc and served as lieutenant governor from 2020 to 2021 Florida District Division 22.

During her year as lieutenant governor, she met Joe Meyer and became interested in The Eye of The Tiger Kiwanis Club, and he invited her to join 2021. The rest is history. She now serves as PR co-chair and co-editor for the EOT club's newsletter.

She has one daughter, Lisa, who is widowed, three grandchildren (one of whom is deceased) and six great-grandchildren. She is helping to raise her 5-year-old great-granddaughter, Aurora in Estero.



TOM WILLIS

Tom Willis was born and raised in Villa Park, Illinois, about 20 miles west of Chicago. He went to Illinois Benedictine College in Lisle, where he met his wife of 40 years, Kathy, on their first day of freshman orientation.

They married between their sophomore and junior years and continued full-time classes while working full-time nights. Work and children interrupted their college careers; however, they ultimately completed their educations at Elmhurst College.

Tom had initially been pre-med and decided to become a paramedic. Meanwhile, he saw an ad for the Lombard Fire Department and filled out the application, took that test, and was hired. He worked there as a firefighter/paramedic for 27 years before an injury rendered him unable to work.

During his tenure at the fire department, he was the president of the Lombard Firefighters Union for 17 years. He was elected as a district vice-president for the Associated Fire Fighters of Illinois. After that, he worked at a large law firm in Chicago as their public service liaison and, until just recently, sat on the Illinois Labor Relations Board for the State of Illinois.

Shortly after going off on disability in 2011 from the fire department, his Kiwanis story began. His wife was the vice-president of the Addison Kiwanis Club. The club met in the evening and did not have great attendance, so she invited him to come along. Having been a firefighter and a volunteer for many years, he was not a stranger to service; he joined the Addison Club in 2014.

The Addison club was not very active in the district nor even the division. Once he became president, he became active at the division level and became a lieutenant governor in 2018-2019. That opened his eyes to what else Kiwanis offered.

He currently serves as the I-I District Chair for the Kiwanis Children's Fund for the past three years and sits on the I-I District Financial Committee. He is running for governor-elect in the I-I district.

When his good friend, Alan Guire, invited him to join The Eye of the Tiger, he immediately said yes. He is excited to get involved in building new clubs.

He and his wife have four adult children and two and a half grandchildren. Their youngest daughter and her husband are expecting their first child in August.

Jim's Gems

Indianapolis, here we come! Here is the magical 3-step close our expert club builders use.

- 1. Build rapport** – you'll never get a second chance to make a first impression. Get people comfortable enough to talk about themselves, their careers, families, and pets.
- 2. Share about Kiwanis** – craft a 30-second explanation of what Kiwanis is. Ask them if they know what Key Club is. If there is an orphaned Key Club (a Key Club without a sponsoring Kiwanis Club), share that with the prospect. Tell them that you think it would be a good idea to have a Kiwanis club in their community. Start filling out the application with them.
- 3. Ask for the dues!** The new dues structure can make it easier to ask because of the proration schedule. Depending on how close you are to the Kiwanis year, you may be able to get two years of dues upfront.

47th Asia Pacific Kiwanis International Convention - April 1-2, 2022, in the Philippines

Asia Pacific countries have a yearly convention called the ASPAC - Asia Pacific Convention. Every Kiwanian worldwide can attend, although the event is focused primarily on the Asia Pacific region. We discussed various topics and elected a Kiwanis International Trustee to represent the Asia Pacific Region on the Kiwanis International board.

Attendees were able to participate in the convention virtually and in person. The fellowship event was held face-to-face in the Philippines on April 2, 2022, at Acacia Hotel.

Philippine Luzon District Past Governor Trinidad "Toto" Gonzales" won the election of ASPAC trustee to the Kiwanis International Board as well as ASPAC Chair-Elect Past Governor Bel Garcia of Philippine Luzon District.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic that caused concern, it was a success. Kiwanians showed efforts of unity, camaraderie, and teamwork. Kiwanis Indiana District Governor, Taka Ogata, delivered Kiwanis's message during the fellowship program of the April 2 event. He spoke at a casual luncheon meeting sponsored by Governor Atty Binx Hodgson of the Philippine South District and her 38 officers/members delegation from the south.

I attended this event with Philippine Luzon District Governor Mario Marasigan, Governor-Elect Juan "JD" Domino, Past Governor Anthony Marasigan, active Kiwanis leader of the South PLG, Lorna Go, and her Kiwanis dancing team, officers, and members. It was three hours of food, conversation, and sharing face to face with Governor Taka about the magic of recruitment, strengthening membership of clubs, and growth. Maybe it was a tiring day for him as the sole representative of KI, but we knew it was a joyful encounter with him as he answered our queries about Kiwanis rules and by-laws. He showed joy as he must have felt the hospitality, generosity, and friendliness of Philippine Kiwanis as family.

An evening program followed at Acacia Hotel, attended by approximately 300 registered attendees. The short program included messages delivered by PLD Governor Mario Marasigan, Philippine South Governor Atty Binx Hodgson, Governor Taka, KI Trustee Elect PG Trinidad Gonzalez, cultural dance from the south, and songs from Luzon Districts. The program ended with fellowship, and happy faces, especially ASPAC Chair Past Governor Raymund Yap and all his committee chairs who helped make the event flow smoothly and successfully.

The following ASPAC schedules and country hosts are AY 2022-2023 (Malaysia), AY 2023-2024 (Australia), and AY 2024-2025 (Taiwan).

We concluded that Kiwanis is a team whose members work together by doing service projects. As a result, our communities benefit, and we make wonderful friends along the way.

Sophie Blair

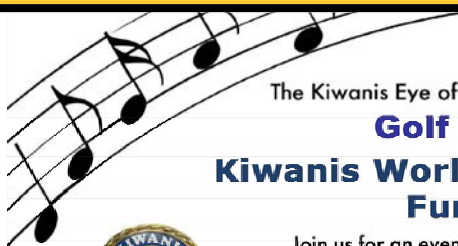


