Guest Speaker – Terry Cunefare

Game on! Kiwanians Take Their Cues with Single Purpose Clubs.

Being a Kiwanian is fun and games – at least to Terry Cunefare, who has combined two of his passions, community service and billiards, to make a powerful impact on his community and the world. The past distinguished governor of the Illinois-Eastern Iowa District of Kiwanis shared how to launch powerful single purpose clubs.



Terry's journey began in 1992 when he joined the Kiwanis Club of East Peoria. He invited his billiard friends to help with community service and fundraising; the next thing you know, they were hooked.

Terry has a passion for sharing Kiwanis, and during his tenure as lieutenant governor of the Illinois-Eastern Iowa District of Kiwanis, he began opening clubs. Jim Rochford was governor of the district at the time and served as his mentor. Terry shared that when he listened to Jim, he was successful, but when he did not listen, he was doomed to fail.

The first club he opened was the Kiwanis Club of Eureka, Illinois, and since then, he has opened over 80 clubs across the United States.

He opened his first billiards-based Kiwanis club, KIDZ for CueSports, with 15 of his friends – all of whom shared a love of pool and giving back to their community. Soon after, they started to work on Fundraiser, including pool cue raffles, silent auctions, and chili cook-offs. They got community youth and the SLPs involved by hosting a Senior Boys and Girls All-Star Game. Other Kiwanis clubs advertised in the program and got rebates for selling ads to first-time advertisers.

The club collected school supplies and dog food, provided Thanksgiving dinner to 6 needy families, and provided Christmas gifts for children through the angel tree.

In January of this year, Terry opened another club, Racking in the River City, based on his love of billiards. They hold their meetings in the billiard hall where they meet, and the owners are part of the 22 charter members.

David Roth

Guy Blair was born and raised in Sacramento, California. He has a 33-year-old daughter from a previous marriage and has been married for ten years to Gloria, who has two grown children. They now call Fruitland, Idaho, home.

Guy joined the Navy after high school and served in Vietnam until he left the Navy in 1974 at the end of his enlistment.

In 1976, he went to work for the State of California at the Office of State Publishing. He worked there for 33 years until he retired as Administration Manager in 2009.

Guy joined Kiwanis in October 2009. He served for ten years in California-Nevada-Hawaii District, followed by three years in the Utah-Idaho District. In both Districts, he served as Club President and Lt. Governor. In 2013-14 he received the Cal-Nev-Ha Lt. Governor Hall of Fame Award.

While in the Cal-Nev-Ha District, Guy:

- Served as the Key Club Advisor at Folsom High School Chartered a K-Kids Club where he also served as the Advisor
- Served on the Cal-Nev-Ha Foundation Board of Directors for three years Served on the Kiwanis Family House Board of Directors for three years and as Board President in his last year.
- Started the Division 44 Formula Team, where he served as the Club Opener to Charter a new club that today has around 40 members.

In the Utah-Idaho District, Guy is a member of four Kiwanis Clubs, including his home club, the Kiwanis Club of Ontario, Oregon, The Kiwanis Club of New Plymouth, Idaho, 25+ Kiwanians Who Care (PNW), and The Eye of the Tiger eKiwanis.

He is currently the Governor-Elect of the Utah-Idaho District and serves the district as the Youth Protection Manager, Aktion Club Administrator, and the Leadership Education Coordinator.



Kerri Gordon

Kerri Gordon from the Florida District, is a native Floridian who grew up in Miami. She has two grown children. Her son, who has autism, is an honorary Kiwanian and has attended more meetings and service projects than some club members.

Kerri's first experience with Kiwanis was in 2010 when her daughter became the president of her Builder's Club. She joined Kiwanis in 2014 when she discovered that her daughter's Key Club needed a Kiwanis advisor.

She has served as a Florida Key Club Zone Administrator, Distinguished President of her home club of Deerfield Beach, and a three-time district chair. She has chartered a K-Kids club and a CKI club and launched and chaired her club's signature project at their Kiwanis SplashPad.

She joined the Eye of the Tiger in early April 2019 when the late Larry Taylor asked Kerri to join a three-day new club blitz on the west coast of Florida. She saw Larry twice more after that – on April 22, 2019, she received the devastating

news of his untimely passing. She is pictured here with Larry on April 7th.

Although Larry had asked Kerri to run for lieutenant governor to serve in the year he would have been governor, she had decided against it. However, she changed her mind after being inspired by the keynote speaker at the 2019 ICON. Alex Sheen, founder of Because I Said I Would, shared how his father always kept his promises. He handed out promise cards to every attendee. Kerri filled out her first promise card with "I will run for lieutenant governor for division 23 in memory of my good friend, Larry Taylor," and handed it to his widow, Marian, who told her that Larry would have wanted her to follow through.

This Kiwanis year, Kerri serves as lieutenant governor for the Kiwanis District of Florida Division 23.

Ingrid Goulbourne

Ingrid Goulbourne was born in St. James, Jamaica, came to the US with her grandparents when she was six years old, and settled in North Miami Beach. After graduating high school, she studied at Broward College for her business administration degree.

She has two grown children as well as five younger siblings.

Ingrid joined the Sawgrass Sunrise Kiwanis in 2011 when a co-worker had invited her to a meeting. She was moved and inspired by the volunteer work and activity with its Key Club, and she was hooked. She later joined a second club, the Kiwanis of Miramar Pembroke Pines, as it was closer to her home and found herself volunteering there.

She is past president and treasurer for both her Kiwanis clubs and past distinguished lieutenant governor for her division for 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 years.

During the pandemic, she organized a gala that raised \$18,000 for the Thirst Project in order to build wells in villages in Africa that lacked clean drinking water.

Ingrid joined the Eye of the Tiger because she was excited to see a team that stood for growing clubs and thought she could learn more about how to help build and grow clubs in her division and district.

In her professional life, Ingrid has served as the installation and service coordinator for Stanley Security Solutions for the past 24 years.


