Jim's Gems


Kiwanis has been gaining momentum to get back to a net increase in membership, and the Tigers are right at the forefront!

Kiwanis International's New Facebook Incentive Designed to Bolster New Club Builds

If you are planning to build a new club, reach out to Kiwanis International!

KI has set up a three-step initiative to help new clubs start on the right foot by harnessing Facebook to build membership before club-building teams appear on the scene.

The advertising begins six weeks before the scheduled club openings.

During the first two weeks, the campaign focuses on awareness. KI will post content about community service and volunteering, focusing on how involvement helps the community as well as the volunteers.

The next step is an introduction to Kiwanis – who we are and what we do.

During the campaign's final two weeks, the posts become more specific. They also include a form for people to fill out for more information. An admin will receive the inquiry, which will be passed on to the person in charge of answering. According to club builder Jay Hubbard, clubs can receive ten or more inquiries from those ads.

Bert West Shares His Thoughts on the Future of Kiwanis

We were fortunate to have Bert West as our guest speaker at our March meeting. If you were unable to attend that meeting, you missed his dynamic and humorous delivery.

The presentation was in a question-and-answer format, with club President, Jim Rochford, delivering the queries.

1. How well would you evaluate where KI is with membership? We are not where we should be with membership. We have a strong staff in KI that is committed to building membership – Kendra Morris is a powerful asset to our team. We have done well in North America this year; however, Asia-Pacific has slowed down.



2. What are your plans to continue the momentum of building up new clubs?

I am working to encourage all governors in North America and worldwide to build new clubs. This involves changing the culture of district leadership. In the past, governors wanted to focus on strengthening existing clubs – that is important, too; however, that was not done either. We shouldn't abandon struggling clubs but building 300-400 new clubs yearly is the only way Kiwanis will continue to survive.

What ideas do you have for ICON to put the focus on new club openings? What are your goals between now and then?

My goal is to build 357 new clubs worldwide. It is going to be challenging but not impossible. Katrina and I are working together to achieve this goal – we want the momentum to continue into the year she becomes international president, so it is definitely at least a two-year plan. We are engaging in the use of live streams of actual club openings, which I hope will get people excited to go out and build clubs themselves.

4. What is your best sales pitch to approve the dues increase at KI?

I didn't know there was a dues increase! I've been told that I am not supposed to call it a dues increase – it's really a dues adjustment (laughs). It's all about putting smiles on children's faces. Everything we do is about our service leadership programs, and nobody does better with service leadership programs than Kiwanis. We must have the increase if we want to continue putting smiles on children's faces.

5. There has been a lot of turnover in KI – how do you evaluate that?

Do you think those changes are positive or helpful to Kiwanis in the long run?

I've never seen a change in a business that wasn't positive unless you made it positive. If someone leaves an organization, we need to be happy for them and support them in the choices they made. As leaders, if we put someone in a position, we need to train, lead, and encourage them, as well as encourage those around them. It's up to us to make the difference a positive one.

6. How can the Eye of the Tiger help you and Kiwanis now and in the future?

We need to open more clubs. Kendra Morris is working hard trying to schedule club openings – she would love to get as many people on the schedule as possible. The Eye of the Tiger can volunteer to help with club openings – even on the local level. Your club can work to help change the culture of Kiwanis worldwide in each of the districts. We must turn the tide in North America to gain more members by building more clubs.

- **2. Develop** (identify, encourage, and support) leaders at the district and international levels in the culture of growing Kiwanis through new club openings.
- **3. Support** new club openings with service projects. Twenty-five to thirty EOT volunteers will be there to follow our mission statement, but more importantly:

To help attain the goals of increasing membership by opening clubs at this year's international convention in Minneapolis.

To help train the Minnesota-Dakotas district's volunteers in membership recruitment.

To support these two new clubs with our own service project – donating a literacy program in the form of books to each of their communities.

ICON Club Build Update Calling all volunteers!

The MinnDak club opening committee has identified three sites – White Bear Lake (pop. 26,000), Hastings, and Northfield (pop. 23,000 each).

All three locations have primary, middle, and high schools in place, and Hastings has two colleges.

Several clubs are willing to sponsor the prospective clubs, including Mankato, St. Cloud, and three clubs in Redwing. Ideally, there would be two club coaches on each site.

Thirty people will be on site (three teams of ten) – if ten more people volunteer, a fourth club could be in the works!

The Eye of the Tiger needs all hands on deck! If you cannot go on location, you can help from home by identifying possible members and setting appointments. If this is your first time, don't worry – we have experienced tigers to guide you.

Member Profiles

Gary Baker

Gary Baker has been a Kiwanian since 1984 and is a proud member and 2018-2019 governor of the Missouri-Arkansas district. As governor, he focused on SLPs, which were his passion.

He grew up on Lake Huron in northern Michigan and attended Northern Michigan University. While on spring break, he got a call from a friend who said he was looking for a computer programmer in Arkansas. Before he could change his mind, he was on his way to Arkansas to finish his education there and start his new career.



When he first joined Kiwanis, he was never asked to participate in any of the club's activities. He began feeling discouraged when a club member returned from ICON with an *Every Child a Swimmer* pamphlet. His club asked him to chair that project, which started with just over 25 children and now involves 300-400 children a year. The city now runs the program, and every third grader in the county now receives free swimming lessons.

Sujan Shrestha



Sujan Shrestha was born in Khandbari, Nepal, but now spends most of his time in the United States.

Ten years ago, he traveled back to Nepal to spend time with his father, who had become terminally ill. In the time they had left together, his father shared that he wanted to build as many libraries as possible in Nepal – both public and within schools. Building one library was not as difficult as building several; they knew they would need help.

Sujan's father said that when he was in the United States, he had seen signs with the letter K on them – he thought whoever put up the signs could help.

Sujan contacted Kiwanis International. Soon, Lee Kuan Yong called him from Malaysia and put him in touch with a gentleman from India who

helped him charter the Kiwanis Club of Kathmandu.

The two things that attracted him to Kiwanis were the IDD project (eliminating iodine deficiency) and the Eliminate project (abolishing neonatal tetanus). Both projects had a profound impact on saving children's lives in his own community.

It was 2016-2017, and Sujan wanted more than chartering only one club. He asked Kiwanis International President Jane Erickson how to form a Kiwanis district in Nepal, and she told him he needed at least 1000 members.

By 2019, Nepal was its own district with over 1000 members and 25 clubs.

Through Kiwanis, Sujan has fulfilled his father's legacy by building a network of volunteers dedicated to improving the lives of children one community at a time.

Signature projects show the impact a Kiwanis club can have on a community. From playgrounds and parks to festivals and fundraisers, signature projects are the hallmarks of what Kiwanis clubs are known for in their communities.

Kiwanis International will host the seventh annual Signature Project Recognition Program for clubs and districts in 2023. Clubs with 27 members or fewer will be judged in the Group I category. Clubs with 28 members or more will be judged in Group II category. Each group will be judged separately and the top 10 finalists will be determined for each group. The top three selections from each group will be recognized as the gold, silver and bronze winners at the 2023 Kiwanis International Convention.


