Our April program was candidates from our clubs seeking to be elected to the International Board. We are first and foremost about membership with an emphasis on new clubs but secondly about leadership and encouraging those who understand the importance of membership to seek leadership positions on both the international and district levels.

Before we know it, ICON will be here, and our impact will be felt across the Kiwanis world as between 40 and 50 members will participate in helping to open three new clubs in the greater Minneapolis area. This will all take place with two days out in the field. Jim's Gems

Minneapolis, here we come! Here is the magical 3-step close our expert club builders use.

- 1. Build rapport you'll never get a second chance to make a first impression. Get people comfortable enough to talk about themselves, their careers, families, and pets.
- 2. Share about Kiwanis craft a 30-second explanation of what Kiwanis is. Ask them if they know what Key Club is. If there is an orphaned Key Club (a Key Club without a sponsoring Kiwanis Club), share that with the prospect. Tell them that you think it would be a good idea to have a Kiwanis club in their community. Start filling out the application with them.
- 3. Ask for the dues! The new dues structure can make it easier to ask because of the proration schedule. Depending on how close you are to the Kiwanis year, you may be able to get two years of dues upfront.


International Trustee Candidates


Ron Hill

Ron has been a Kiwanian since 1995. He has a background in construction and has owned and operated his own firm for over 25 years. His home club is the Kiwanis Club of Conway, and he is a past governor of the Missouri-Arkansas district.

Ron says that his greatest strength is enthusiasm. He believes in Kiwanis and understands that the more people we ask to join, the more we can do.

- 1. How would you envision imparting the vision of new membership in your district and on your board? The key is enthusiasm. If they see you are out there helping, they will get inspired. Do things to get people enthused. We are the <u>only</u> ones that focus exclusively on kids.
- 2. What do you think is the single most important thing you, as a new international board member, can bring to the table?





Closing Remarks: I have always been interested in working with kids in his community, and from 1968 until 2021, I ran a baseball and softball program involving more than 1500 kids. I was also a football coach for 51 years. I have been greatly inspired by the people I have met. Despite our differences, we always agree that we need to help kids. I have fun getting out there and talking to people. I love watching young kids grow up with Kiwanis and move up from K-KIDS all the way through Circle K.

Mohan Lamsal (International Trustee-At-Large Candidate for Kiwanis ASPAC)



Mohan joined Kiwanis in 2015 and currently serves as the membership growth chair for Kiwanis ASPAC. Mohan is a founding member of the first Kiwanis Club in Nepal and was among the first to join Kiwanis there. He is an active member of the Kiwanis Club of Kathmandu, the Kiwanis Club of Peace Nepal, Kiwanis Club of Likasi, Kiwanis Club of Eye of the Tiger, and the Kiwanis Club of Helping Hands India.

Mohan served as governor during the pandemic, and during his tenure, he opened 36 new clubs in Nepal. In addition, he invited and inspired many people to join Kiwanis, especially since so many children had lost their parents.

Immediate Past Kiwanis International President Peter Mancuso inspired him to help build Kiwanis clubs in India. Mohan has traveled to India many times to build clubs there – he is excited to know that India will soon be its own district.

1. How would you envision imparting the vision of new membership in your district and on your board?

We need to focus on how to inspire the community and grow clubs. We must make people understand what Kiwanis is about and why we need it. We need to make an impact through service projects as well as fundraising to sustain and increase membership. We need Kiwanis for needy children.

- 2. What do you think is the single most important thing you, as a new international board member, can bring to the table? We need to plan how to grow and make a strong international image and organization.
- 3. There will be a dues increase proposed at ICON this year of \$30 per year. What is your personal view concerning this increase? We need to have adequate funding to continue our work. Arguments always exist for and against raising dues; however, an organization will only survive if adequately funded. We need to increase our dues to make KI stronger I'm not sure how much, however.

Closing Remarks:

My entire family has joined Kiwanis, and my brother is the current governor of the Nepal district. All have a heart for serving children. We need to focus on children in need. 600 million children are suffering in Southeast Asia. They need good nutrition as well as education.

The children need us.

Babukrishna Karki

Babukrishna Karki of Kathmandu, Nepal, is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Kathmandu City, Nature Conservation Nepal and Janakpur, where he also is a past president.

He served as Kiwanis Children's Fund District Chair in 2020-21 and is a George F. Hixson Fellow. He is currently serving a three-year term as Kiwanis Children's Fund trustee.

Karki said that he was drawn to Kiwanis after he saw how much an earthquake had devastated the lives of children – he could not stand to see the children in his country suffer. Children all around the world need Kiwanis!



In addition to his work with Kiwanis International, Karki is involved in rescue and relief services and human-wildlife conflict work. He is also a philanthropy ambassador for the Kathmandu Institute of Child Health.

Karki earned a master's degree in political science from Tribhuvan University in Nepal. He was formerly a brigadier general in the Nepal Army and currently works as a member of the International Union for Conservation of Nature.

He enjoys photography, skydiving, tennis, nature conservation, and tours in his free time. His wife of 35 years, Gita Gurung Karki, is also a member of the Kiwanis Club of Janakpur. The couple have seven children.
