Our Eye of the Tiger Members with help from the MinnDak District volunteers and Kiwanis International Staff will be developing three sites around the Minneapolis District, White Bear Lake, Hastings, Elk River are the chosen sites for the newest Kiwanis Club in the Mn Dak District.



VP Candidates Look Towards the Future

Our club president, Jim Rochford, interviewed two of our members who are running for international vice president — Chuck Fletcher from the Kentucky-Tennessee district and Michael Mulhaul from the New Jersey district. We are proud and honored that they are part of our club.

Opening Remarks:

Chuck: Thank you all for inviting me here to speak. I have been in Kiwanis for 18 years, and during that time, I have learned a lot about what we can do to make an impact in the community.

I was governor of my district for the 2015-2016 Kiwanis year, and we were the only district in the U.S. that exhibited positive growth that year. It was because we worked as a team. I am not afraid to get on the ground and work with everyone to make a difference.

Michael: I have been a member of Kiwanis and a member of the Kiwanis Club of Greater Parsippany for 32 years, although I have never lived or worked there.

Three years ago, I became a charter member of the Kiwanis Club of Asbury Park. Initially, that club started out as entirely virtual, although now we meet in person. I have also been a member of the Eye of the Tiger for the past three years.

I have been married for over 30 years and have three children, and I am expecting my third grandchild in June.

I have been a financial advisor for over 30 years and help people with their educational and financial goals as well as other types of financial planning.

As you know, the Eye of the Tiger focuses on opening new clubs. Along with several other service organizations, Kiwanis has faced decreased membership and has lost clubs. What emphasis would you put on new club openings, and how would you execute new club openings for future membership growth?

Michael: To maintain current membership, we would have to open 300-350 new clubs per year. One way to achieve this is to encourage existing clubs to open new clubs. My home club in Parsippany was opened by a club in Denville. All clubs have members who are centers of influence – they can be instrumental in bringing in new members and starting new clubs. It is also important to retain the members that we bring in. We have to grow, maintain, and engage. We need to look at how ASPAC and Malaysia are building clubs and maintaining members.

Chuck: As Michael said, the Eye of the Tiger is a big influence for club growth. We have a problem in the U.S. We have to be super creative, but we have forgotten to learn how to dream. Kiwanis has been in the valley too long, and we need to climb to the top. We have to dream to grow. The answer is simple – listen to people on the ground and get together with them to achieve our goals. We need to show compassion and love for all the children.

As members of the Kiwanis International Board and as leaders of the Kiwanis organization, you will be tasked with leading by example. We have faced membership challenges since the 2009-2010 Kiwanis year, when we lost 1/3 of our membership. How do you plan to motivate the board to increase membership and lead by example?

Chuck: I am an example to follow. I go out and invite people to join. I give them opportunities to express themselves, and I teach them how to invite others. My club went from five people to 86 members through my efforts and teaching others what I have done. We must have a willingness and a plan – and I do have a plan. We all can make a difference.

Michael: Every member of the board must realize that they are part of growing and maintaining our great organization. We need to reach out to potential members and engage them in order to grow. They need to have a positive experience, or they will not stay. We all must work together not only to grow membership but to make sure members are engaged. Then others will be encouraged to be a part of Kiwanis. I stress that it is everybody's responsibility on the board to work together to achieve this. If we all work together, great things will happen.

ICON is a wonderful time for Kiwanians to get together. During your year as president, how would you utilize ICON to increase membership and include helpful training?

Michael: Training must be done in person, as we did in Indianapolis. I would encourage people to sign up for the ACE (Achieving Club Excellence) program. It is important for Kiwanians to share their success stories about how they built their clubs and engaged their members. If we don't get together, nothing happens – it's just a conversation. Great things happen when we all work together.

Chuck: Right now, KI has only one expectation; that is, all you have to do is pay your dues. That's it – you don't have to do anything else. How do we get people more involved? What are our expectations? KI has no expectations. That needs to change, and we need to take responsibility.

Closing Statements:

Michael: In every club I belong to, experience is the most important. Our experience has to be the best. We all have to have a reason to get together – in our case, it is to help children. We can partner with other organizations and work together – we do not have to be competitors. In order to build and maintain membership, we must have worthy projects along with goals to grow year after year. We are one organization, and we need to treat it as one. We are the best worldwide.

Chuck: As Kiwanians, we all know that the folks in this room are already leaders. We have three things to remember about growing a successful organization:

- 1. We need great leadership. Without that, we will fail.
- 2. We need to look at our culture nothing is impossible. We have to say, "we can do that!"
- 3. What is our purpose? We need to spread our story and tell the world that Kiwanis is alive and well.

- **2. Develop** (identify, encourage, and support) leaders at the district and international levels in the culture of growing Kiwanis through new club openings.
- **3. Support** new club openings with service projects. Thirty to Thirty Five EOT volunteers will be there to follow our mission statement, but more importantly:

To help attain the goals of increasing membership by opening clubs at this year's international convention in Minneapolis.

To help train the Minnesota-Dakotas district's volunteers in membership recruitment.

To support these three new clubs with our own service project – donating a literacy program in the form of books to each of their communities.

New Leadership in Technology Lights Up ASPAC

Belle Garcia is a past district governor from the Philippine Luzon District. She worked for the U.S. embassy in Manila for 24 years before relocating to Guam in 2019.

She has been a Kiwanian for 32 years and is currently the 2022-2023 ASPAC chair. ASPAC has grown 49% in the past decade with 379 new clubs and 9,442 new members. She is taking Guam by storm after opening her first club there in 2021, with a second club ready to charter.

Belle began the Leadership in Technology Initiative, born during the COVID pandemic. She realized that she needed to harness the technology required to keep current members engaged and offer new members the opportunity to join Kiwanis. Out of this, Kiwanis 4.0 was born.

What's inside? Users can access free Zoom meeting usage, including live language translations during any Zoom meeting. Kiwanians can connect with other members and stay informed with news, articles, and messages. All district information is conveniently located in one place, including webinars, leadership training, and an online fundraising platform. In addition, members can access ASPAC, district, and international events through one convenient portal.

The concept is simple – engage all current members and bring in new members who are already looking at their cell phones waiting to be reached. The next volunteer, member, or donor is already here – they just need to be brought in.

Kiwanis 4.0 is not just websites, online payments, and online events. It's a tool to create the ASPAC virtual office, enabling Kiwanians to catch up and prepare for the future.

This platform is open to all members who can access Kiwanis 4.0 through the Q-code provided here or by going to *kiwanisaspac.org*.
