



Katrina J. Baranko of Albany, Georgia, U.S., was elected president of the board of trustees at the 2023 Kiwanis International Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota, U.S. Lee Kuan Yong of Petaling Jaya, Malaysia, was chosen to be president-elect. They begin their new terms on October 1, 2023.

Michael Mulhaul of Interlaken, New Jersey, U.S., was elected vice president of the organization.

These three Kiwanians were elected trustees for the United States and Pacific Canada Region for 2023-2026: Dennis Baugh, Palmyra, Virginia; Matthew Cantrall, Lakeland, Florida; Cathleen Ann "Cathy" Tutty, Butte, Montana

Chang-Ching Hsu of Tainan City, Taiwan, was elected during the Asia-Pacific convention in March to represent the Asia-Pacific Region as a Kiwanis International trustee. 2023-2026

Mohan Lamsal, Kathmandu, Nepal, was elected as an at-large trustee. 2023-2026

The House of Delegates voted on one proposed amendment to the Kiwanis International Bylaws. The delegates voted against a proposal put forth by the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees to increase members' annual dues to help address a growing deficit.

Amazing Eye of the Tiger Team Builds Three New Clubs at ICON 2023, By Amphy Lim

The story began as early as January 2023, when EOT President Jim Rochford and his team of Tigers began to plan the monumental task of opening three new clubs at the 2023 Kiwanis International Convention site in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Although it may look easy, the planning process is time-consuming and intricate. Before the Tigers set foot in Minnesota, volunteers had already completed work hours, including gathering names of prospective members and setting appointments. Even those who stayed home worked tirelessly by confirming appointments and updating spreadsheets.

Team members planned logistics several weeks in advance. Immediate Past President, Joe Meyer, had reserved a block of rooms at a local Hampton Inn. Some people lived close enough to drive in; however, those who flew in received shuttle service from gracious volunteers.

I marvel at how so many people from different countries and backgrounds could get together to make this all happen. People from all positions in Kiwanis jumped in to help, from current Kiwanis International President-Elect Lee Kuan Yong, who organized every project detail on a Google spreadsheet, to the newest members.

As I flew to Minnesota, I felt apprehensive. I did not know what I was getting into, as this was my first time opening clubs in a faraway place. Most of the people I'd be working with had met on Zoom meetings, so the butterflies in my stomach were real! All I had in my heart was that we were all Kiwanians – people with one common goal, helping the children of the world.



Soon after I arrived at the hotel, all my worries faded away. President Jim Rochford had a plan, and that night he rallied the troops at our first in-person club opening meeting. He offered inspiration and encouragement before we took three communities by storm the next day. White Bear Lake led by Jim Rochford, Elk River led by Barb Thompson, Laura Gilliland, and Jay Hubbard, and Hastings led by Joe Meyer.

I was part of the Hastings group, so I will focus mainly on my experience there. Although I found it challenging to meet people I had never met and knew nothing about, I knew that we had something compelling to offer – the opportunity to change the world and improve children's lives through the best service organization in the world, Kiwanis.

On the first day in the field, we recruited eight new members to the Kiwanis Club of Hastings. The next day, we recruited several more members into the Hastings club – we ultimately had 17 more members than the required minimum members required to build a club. How amazing is that?

Joe Meyer led an orientation program that included a brief history of the founding of Kiwanis, its membership in more than 86 countries, the SLP Programs, and literacy education in serving the children of the world. We introduced the new club to the district mentoring coach, Bruce Klair, under the team of District Governor Steve Handegaard, to assist them and broaden their knowledge of the organization.

Some of us talked about significant service projects our clubs have done in our countries to inspire and encourage them to do the same or better for their community and children. They elected Keith Vieths as their club president, who is eager, enthusiastic, and compassionate.

This is our reward – we achieved our goal of making a difference in the world by opening new clubs. Kiwanis is like a giant kettle – we

pour ingredients into it to create unity with commitment, respect, cooperation, and friendship.

I appreciate all who have helped with building all three clubs in Minnesota. We had so many unsung heroes who tirelessly worked on the field and behind the scenes to make this year's club opening project successful! There are too many to mention, and I wouldn't want to leave anyone out! You all deserve it!

To all my wonderful Eye of the Tiger Kiwanis family, you made me feel like an extraordinary person on this journey. I learned so much, and it made me stronger in my commitment to serving others. Together, we blend in one thought and heart and share our passion for helping others.
