

It's a Mad, Mad, Mad World!

Treasure Hunt in Malaysia Raises a Fortune for Down Syndrome Centre

Ask Lee Kuan Yong – fundraising is nothing but fun in the Malaysia District, especially when it involves his home club of Kuala Lumpur (KL).

The Kiwanis Treasure Hunt in Malaysia is the largest consecutive annual motoring treasure hunt in Malaysia's Guinness Book of World Records!

What is the Kiwanis Treasure Hunt?

- An annual fundraiser organized by KL.
- Organized every year since 1984 without fail (even during the pandemic when it was virtual)
- Funds were initially donated to various local charities and children's homes.
- A few years later, KL members began thinking about a long-term, permanent project for the club, which the Kiwanis Treasure Hunt would fund.
- In 1989, an idea was born! The Kiwanis of KL created the signature project several years before Kiwanis International came up with the term Kiwanis Down Syndrome Centre was born.
- Since 1989, 70% of the funds raised have been used to finance the Kiwanis Down Syndrome Centre; the remainder is used for other service projects and donations.

How does the Kiwanis Treasure Hunt work?

- It is a family fun holiday weekend for a good cause.
- The event is intellectually stimulating for its participants.
- Participants travel in their motor vehicles (two to four people in a car) from a starting point to a final destination using tulips as their road map (tulips are puzzles with hints embedded in them, which participants solve using landmarks and signs to get closer to their destinations).
- Corporate sponsors are invited and encouraged to make monetary contributions. In return, their logos are prominently displayed on each vehicle.
- Over 150 cars and 600 people can participate.

This year's 40th anniversary fundraiser, The Ruby Trail, will occur from September 23rd through September 25th. The goal is to reach US\$110,000.


