


Member Profiles

Dr. Delores Lewis

Dr. Delores Lewis, a distinguished Past District Governor, is celebrating her 28th year as a Kiwanian and a member of the Kiwanis Club Barbados Central. She holds the honor of being the first Kiwanian from Barbados to have served as governor of the Eastern Canada and Caribbean (ECC) District in the 50-year history of the Kiwanis movement in Barbados.

Delores initially had doubts about joining Kiwanis due to the requirement of attending three consecutive meetings before submitting a membership application, which seemed challenging given her busy career. However, the club made an exception for her, and she became a dedicated Kiwanian.

Dr. Delores Lewis's leadership within Kiwanis has been both diverse and impactful. Her journey has seen her hold various leadership



Dr. Delores Lewis's leadership was put to the test when the COVID-19 pandemic disrupted her initial plans as governor of the ECC district. Despite the challenges, she quickly adapted and focused on driving growth and motivation within the clubs. Her refusal to let the pandemic define her leadership resulted in remarkable growth within her district, a testament to her resilience and adaptability.

Delores was introduced to EOT by Joe Meyer and was inspired by the concept of increasing membership and opening new clubs. She eagerly participated in the EOT's new club openings at ICON 2023 in Minnesota. Despite it being her first time opening clubs with the EOT, she was thrilled to see that everyone she invited accepted the invitation!

EOT Club's Mission Statement:

Eye of the Tiger, eKiwanis I-I Mission (Why We Exist)

The mission of the Eye of the Tiger eKiwanis, I-I, is to increase membership by opening new Kiwanis clubs throughout the world.

Eye of the Tiger, eKiwanis I-I Goals (Accomplishments to Achieve this Mission)

- 1. Lead by example and train others by opening clubs.
- -Open at least two clubs at the site of ICON (when ICON is in North America and whenever possible elsewhere).
- -Open a club in the district of members who are governors.
- -Support other club members in opening clubs on a voluntary basis.

- **2. Develop** (identify, encourage, and support) leaders at the district and international levels in the culture of growing Kiwanis through new club openings.
- 3. Support new club openings with service projects. Thirty to Thirty Five EOT volunteers will be there to follow our mission statement, but more importantly:

To help attain the goals of increasing membership by opening clubs at this year's international convention in Denver.

To help train the Colorado district's volunteers in membership recruitment.

To support these three new clubs with our own service project – donating a literacy program in the form of books to each of their communities.

Tom Sorfleet – Reluctant Kiwanian Gets Hooked on Service

Tom Sorfleet is the president of the Kiwanis of Sugar Grove Township in Illinois, opened by the Eye of the Tiger in 2021. This club has grown from a fledgling organization to an active, vibrant force in its community.

Jim Rochford interviewed him during our August club meeting and asked him all the tough questions.

JIM: Tell us about your past –high school days, etc., and what brought you to your career.

TOM: Wow! Do you want me to remember that far back? I'm a Southside
Chicago guy. After high school, I went to a college in Madison, Wisconsin. I
finished college at Northern Illinois University and studied poly-sci and business administration.

When I graduated college, the federal government was in the midst of a hiring freeze, so I fell back on what had paid for my college – managing restaurants. I was VP for Buca di Beppo and opened Weber Grill Restaurants.

I left the restaurant business in 2018 and got involved in insurance. Farmers courted me, and I bought an agency from a guy who was retiring.

In 2021, two Kiwanians walked into my office, and I gave them a check to get them to leave. I didn't want to go to any meetings, but I ended up going to one because the owner of the bar where the meeting was taking place was someone to whom I wanted to sell insurance. I ended up planning events for the club, and when the president stepped down, I became the new president.

JIM: You started your club with about 15 to 20 members. Your numbers have risen. Why don't you tell us a little about how you have increased your membership?

TOM: When I became president, we had 17 members, which increased to 24. The members joke that I talk to everyone to bring them in.

JIM: Can you share some of your club's highlights since its start and some of the projects you are most proud of?

TOM: The biggest project was Holiday in the Grove. Sugar Grove holds that event every Christmas. The organizers had begun to retire or pass away, so our club took over and ran with it. We have installed new handicapped swings for each park and donated \$1000 to each Key Club member with exemplary leadership skills. Our club is heavily involved in the community, so much so that we are the go-to organization for citizens and other organizations for help and guidance.

JIM: What are your club's demographics?

TOM: Our youngest member is a college sophomore helping us start a club at the local college. Members stretch from him up to—well, I won't give away the ages (laughs). We have a mix of corporate and individual members as well as male and female members in various occupations.

JIM: That is a description of a successful club! Although you're a modest guy, you've been pivotal in the club's success. Your background has prepared you well. We appreciate your ongoing commitment and dedication because leadership is critical in a new club. Is there anything else you would like to share?

TOM: We're a club that keeps trying to do what is right for our community and kids. Whenever we consider new projects, we always ask the same question: how do the kids benefit?

JIM: I appreciate your willingness to step up. Who knows, maybe one day you'll want to serve as lieutenant governor of your division!

TOM: DON'T start that! (laughs)

Since there were a few minutes left, Barb Thompson asked Tom a few questions of her own.

BARB: The Eye of the Tiger helps new clubs with their first service project by providing books to distribute. Can you share how your club has given out these books?

TOM: We gave out 80% of the books during Cornfest, a big, local event. We took the rest to another event at the library, where we set up a table and gave out books. Those events were so successful that we received donations to purchase an additional 100 books to distribute. Later, we received book donations from a local author that we gave out at other events. We have given over over 300 books so far!

BARB: How does your club work with the Key Club?

TOM: We work very closely with the Key Club. When they held their annual coat drive, we helped them put boxes in local businesses to collect gently used coats. We also collaborate on Christmas and Halloween events. We do a lot of mutual events, and we provide a vehicle for homecoming.

BARB: Tell us about that famous radio station interview.

TOM: That was a while ago. One of our club members set up the interview, which was very similar to this interview. It's incredible how so many people don't know what Kiwanis does!

Laura Gilliland predicted that Tom would be the I-I governor soon!
